The Forest Service has approved our July 7, 8, 9, and 10 Monte Cristo Star party. They were concerned that with all the snow this winter, the meadow would be to wet to allow vehicles to drive out there. The firebreak road and the meadow were dry last week and we now have our permit.

The star party events will be the same as they have been in the past. We will be at the Monte Cristo campground, loop E. They don't allow reservations so we could get spread out a little. Camping is \$12.00 per night and they have restrooms with running water and flush toilets. We will have our usual Pot Luck dinners Friday and Saturday evenings about 6:00 pm. Bring something for the barbeque and a side dish to share, we should have enough portable grills to share but if you have one bring it along. If you would like to come for the star party but don't want to camp, that?s OK too. You can park in the meadow or at someone?s campsite and join us, you don't even need a telescope, there will be plenty there you can look through.
