What's up in November

November can be a fun month to view the sky at night. Some of the summer's constellations are still visible and the winter constellations are starting to come up. There are also several meteor showers. Another good thing is that it starts getting dark earlier so you can still use your telescope and get your sleep.

I have been watching comet Swan in the evening. It has brightened a bit and was almost visible naked eye a few nights ago. I hear it is getting a little dimmer again. It is still fun to see a comet, even when you need binoculars or a telescope. It has moved from Bootes to Hercules. It is a beautiful blue fuzzball. I haven't been able to see more than a hint of a tale from my front yard. A couple of other things to look for are:

11/05 16 UT	Meteor shower peak - Taurids S
11/08 22 UT and Far East	Transit of Mercury for the Americas
11/12 15 UT	Meteor shower peak - Taurids N
11/17 21 UT	Meteor shower peak – Leonids

We plan to get together as a club at Doug Say's home to observe the Mercury Transit. It begins at about noon and finishes at 5:08. We are also planning to have a potluck lunch so bring something good to eat. It should be a fun activity. Doug's home is at 2060 W. 1025 N. Farr West. To get there take the Harrisville and head West. Turn North on the highway to the west of the freeway. Park at Doug Say Auto (100 yards north of CAL store), we will be set up on the lawn.
